"I am pleased and relieved that this labour dispute has finally been settled with the ratification of the first collective agreement for Ekati employees. I would like to congratulate both sides for their efforts incoming to a fair agreement," said Bevington.

"It is pertinent that we build a stable workforce in the Northwest Territories. We have a plethora of resources, with more jobs than skilled Northern workers. Unions can help provide that stabilization to ensure the large companies who do business in the North reach their maximum potential. At the same time, companies such as BHP Billiton bring employment to Northerners through the development of our diamond resources," said Bevington.
